Trustees' Annual Report Year ended 31 December 2022

The trustees present their Annual Report and Financial Statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2022. The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in Note 1 to the Accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trusee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charitites: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of a Unitary Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the Church and are chosen from those members of the Church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the Minister and meets six times a year. It is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the Church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The ordinary diet of worship in Cullen & Deskford is weekly, 11am at Hall Church on 1st Sunday and 10.30am in the Old Kirk Cullen on 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of the month. Additionally, a service is held at Deskford on 2nd and 4th Sundays at 12 noon.

Social events which reach out to the community include:-

Coffee mornings, Easter and Christmas Fairs and Thrift Shop,

Easter services create opportunities for ecumenical services and close links with the local school allow their participation in both Christmas and Easter Services.

The Auld Kirk is open to the public from 2-4pm on 3-5 days per week from May to September.

Ministers Report

I'm not an avid watcher of the Oscars, or any other nomination event. However, I am aware that when when the 'celebrity' is presented with their award they will inevitably make a speech. It will only last a few minutes, but this will be their opportunity to thank those who inspired them towards stardom and fame. It's good to offer our appreciation. That appreciation is also extended to the rest of the Business and Social committee members. Without their contribution and willingness to attend meetings and for their input, we would not have a Church. They are true stars indeed.

Session Clerk Report 2022

In 2022 life in the Church slowly started to return to normal. Morning worship continued at the Hall Church until April due to lack of heating at the Auld Kirk. We were able to continue worshipping there until the end of October when the cooler weather forced us back to the Hall Church.

The hire of the Hall Church continued to grow during the year with two new lets and all previous user returning. There was also quite a few birthday parties held throughout the year.

Our fundraising events returned with the usual Easter and Christmes fairs, a coffee morning and the thrift sale was held over five days in July. A big thank you has to go to the Social committee for organising all these events and to everyone who . contributed to their success.

We celebrated the Queens Platinum Jubilee with a concert, where we were entertained by Bill and Joe and two Highland dancers. A lovely evening was had by all.

Isobel Addison resigned from Session after serving for 24 years as an Elder. Isobel was one of the first female Elders to be appointed by Cullen and Deskford Church in 1998. Over the years Isobel did various tasks but she will be remembered mostly for organising the fundraising events over the past ten or so years. We thank Isobel for her hard work and dedication to the Church.

There are eleven active Elders at present and we have a membership of 233.

The Moray Presbytery Plan was completed in 2022 and as Cullen and Deskford decided to form a grouping/linkage/union with Portsoy, Ordiquhill and Cornhill rather than go into a Union with Buckie churches, Portknockie and Findochty, we were excluded from that plan. We are included in Buchan Presbytery Plan and wait to hear what structure is proposed within it. In 2022 the Church of Scotland started the process of reducing the number of buildings it owns. An AMBA (Asset Management Building Audit) report was conducted on all buildings (excluding manses) and the buildings were catergorised as A (retain) or B (dispose). As Cullen and Deskford were no longer included in the Moray Plan and we could not vote for the approval of the Buchan Plan it was decided to categorise both our buillings B and a decision would be made by the new North East and Northern Isles Presbytery by the end of March 2023

I take great pleasure in presenting the accounts with a small profit for the year in the general account. Once again thank you to all office bearers for their hard work and to all who help and support our local church.

Fabric Report for 2022

At the beginning of the year we were awarded a grant from CARES of up to £101,000 to put a renewable heating source in the Auld Kirk. Preparation work was carried out prior to the system being installed but it has been delayed. We are hopeful the work will be carried out in 2023.

The Hall Church drains were blocked and the unblocking of them has led to outstanding work on the drainage system to be carried out in early 2023. Two of the lights in the Hall Church need replaced and this will require scaffolfing to be erected to complete the work.

The snagging of the Manse is still to be completed.

Guild Report

A donation of £100.00 was made to the Guild Project, £50.00 to Beat, There is Hope and £50.00 to Pioneers, Chocolate Heaven: South East Asia. £8.54 was sent to the Fellowship of the Least Coin and £50.00 was donated to the Church for heating and lighting. At the AGM on 7th April, a discussion took place whether we should remain as part of the Church of Scotland Guild. The 11 Members took the decision that they wished to close the Guild. It was further decided that we should still meet as a ladies group attached to the Church. The first meeting of the new group was on 6th October 2023 with an attendance of 20 ladies. The name of this group was decided as Cullen & Deskford Church Thursday Get-together.

Financial Reviews

Principal sources of income continue to be from members' weekly offerings, fundraising events as detailed below and hire of church premises.

A restoration fund was set up in 2016 for work estimated at approx £350,000 to the Auld Kirk.

22 Members giving by standing order,

5 significant fundraising events were held - Easter Fair, Jubilee Concert, Thrift Fair for 5 days, Coffee morning and Christmas Fair.

Risk Management

The Kirk Session are acutely aware of the ageing problems facing the Congregation and discussions and debates are ongoing in formulating strategies in a serious endeavour to address this issue.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately six months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £73,894 £18,554 was held in the General Account.

The Church also held £160,158 of restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in note 2.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The Members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Independent Examiner

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks .explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

5 All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all minister's stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Minister's stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £28,700 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) £35,269.

7 Transfers

Legacies/Trusts are grouped together and invested through the Church of Scotland. Dividends are received twice yearly and are paid into the Reserve account. The amount is distributed to the other bank accounts(restricted and unrestricted) based on the percentage of money invested.

Charitable Account - Money is invested in Halifax Aviva Shares and the twice yearly dividend is paid into the Reserve account and then transferred to the Restricted Charitable account.

Consolidated Fabric Fund - This is held by Church of Scotland in Edinburgh and interest can be transferred into the General account on receipt of relevant building/fabric receipts (e.g insurance, heating, lighting, organ maintenance).

8 Grants

A grant to the value of £10,000 was received from Weston Garfield to fund the restoration work at the Auld Kirk.
